Our Goal

The Kansas Family First Prevention Service Evaluation examines the impact of prevention programs to strengthen families and prevent child welfare involvement in the state of Kansas. This project assesses implementation and outcomes related to the delivery of these community-based programs targeting 5 areas: mental health, parent skill building, kinship navigation, substance use, and other prevention services. **Our goal is to provide evidence of the effectiveness of prevention services in Kansas to keep children safely with their families whenever possible.**

Mental Health services are therapeutic services delivered by a qualified clinician such as Parent Child Interaction Therapy, and Multi-Systemic Therapy.

Parent Skill Building services are in-home skill-based programs that include parenting skills training and education, including Parents as Teachers, Family Mentoring, Fostering Prevention, Family Centered Treatment (FCT) and Healthy Families America.

Kinship Navigation programs like Kids2Kin provide legal help for kinship families, eliminating legal barriers around permanency for kinship families.

Substance Use services include treatment services delivered by a qualified clinician, such as Substance Treatment and Recovery Teams (START), Parent Child Assistance Program, Strengthening Families and Seeking Safety.

Other Prevention Services are delivered by Kansas Legal Services (Parent Advocate Program) in Cowley, Reno, Sedgwick and Wyandotte; and Sedgwick County Sheriff's Office (Community Support Specialist) in Sedgwick county.
